

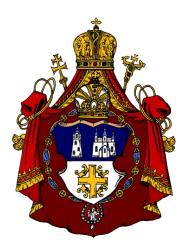

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Annual Assembly Minutes December 4, 2022

The annual meeting was called to order with a prayer at 1:05. The meeting was held in person in the Church Social Hall.

Opening Remarks. Trusteeship President, Milan Visnick, opened the meeting, welcoming those in attendance. Copies of the agenda and all reports (see attached) were distributed at the meeting and made available on-line.

Priest's Report. Father Vasilije's gave his report.

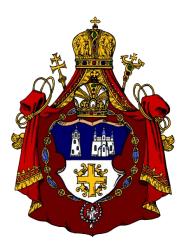
Liturgical Life: Father's report included all the liturgical events we had in 2022. We celebrated the Divine Liturgy 142 times.

Church Events. Since the last Annual Assembly, we had 51 notable events in our parish.

Church Beautification Project. Our highlight in 2022 for the Beautification project was the arrival of the Icon of the Mother of God *Trojerucica*. The icon was funded exclusively by free will donations. We thank our group of pilgrims who traveled to Greece to escort the icon. We also thank Drs. Donald and Draginja Fish for generously donating the precious stones for the icon. Our Iconostasis, Icons, Throne for the *Trojerucica*, Bishop's Throne and Altar Table are expected to be completed December 10th and will be shipped with Milsped Transportation Company. We thank Maya Mandic for coordinating the transportation.

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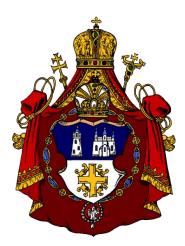
Previous Year's Minutes. The reading of minutes from last year was waived.

President's Report. Milan Visnick summarized highlights from the President's Report. Milan's report is available online. If anyone has any questions, please do not hesitate to reach out to Milan. 2022 brought increased optimism as COVID restrictions were lifted. With the blessing of His Grace, Bishop Irinej, there were changes to the Trusteeship Board as a result of shifting positions and resignations. With the resignation of Maja Lojanica as Financial Secretary, Predrag Djokic moved from Member-at-Large to Financial Secretary, and Aleksandar Dukic was appointed as Member-at-Large. We installed a state-of-the-art security system to protect and safeguard our church. We extend our heartfelt congratulations to Dobrila Lojanica, Kolo President, on receiving a Diocesan Gramata for her many years of dedicated service, and we congratulate Father Vasilije on being appointed Dean of the Washington Deanery by His Grace, Biship Irinej. A stewardship pledge form for 2023 will be made available later this month, and everyone is encouraged to participate. Stewardship is a mechanism to show our commitment to this parish by pledging our financial support and sharing the talents that God has blessed us with by volunteering and participating in parish life. The Trusteeship is committed to ultimately moving this parish from a Trusteeship to an elected Board of Directors. Before this can happen, we must have the monthly funding gaps eliminated, build a financial reserve for contingencies and loan paydown, and have a continued increase in demonstrated support and commitment to this parish by its parishioners.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>. John Buffalini presented the Treasurer's Report, including a summary of the year's major financial happenings, a review of the fiscal year-to-date income and expenses, trends, and anticipated 2022 income versus proposed budget expenditures.

Income. Our income has consisted of two parts – Operational Income and Beautification Income. Our operational income for the year was \$355,048. Our 2022 fiscal year operational income was approximately \$28,000 lower than fiscal year 2021. This is heavily driven by not having our SerbFest fundraiser.

Expenses. Our total operational expenses were \$358,647.73. Our expenses were lower than the previous year because we did not host SerbFest. However, focusing only on the mortgage, admin/building/maintenance, and liturgical expenses, our 2022 Fiscal Year expenses were approximately \$6,500 higher than 2021.



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Church Beautification Project. Donations for the Church Beautification project totaled \$52,579.46 and expenses totaled \$43,983.18. Expenses for 2022 were paid to Monastery Hilandar for the Trojerucica – Icon of the Holy Mother of God and to our stone mason as an advance for the new altar table. We have \$78,620.39 funds remaining for Phase 1. Any funds remaining after Phase one has concluded, will be used for subsequent phases.

Trends and Reminders. In previous years, the Trusteeship undertook as many cost-cutting measures as possible. However, we have come to a point where we cannot cost-cut much further. The church continues to have no viable savings and any financial cushions we typically build in our Operating accounts are depleted to cover unexpected expenses such as repairs. Furthermore, we continue to experience very lean summer months.

<u>Other Reports</u>. Next, reports were presented or submitted by the leads of the following parish auxiliary organizations— Audit Board (Subdeacon Miodrag Lazarevich), Candle Shop (Dejan Bujak), Sunday School (Joyce Visnick – presented by Milan Visnick), Serbian Singing Society "Lira" (Protonica Jelena Vranic), Children's Choir (Protonica Jelena Vranic), Circle of Serbian Sisters (Nina Lojanica). All reports were distributed at the meeting and made available on-line, and parishioners had the opportunity to ask questions of all the leads.

New Business: Other Questions & Answers. Mark Rasevic provided information during New Business. We will hold SerbFest in the spring and an Old Calendar New Year's Celebration on Friday, January 13, 2023. We will be selling food, including roasted pigs, over the holidays. Our St. Sava Commemoration will be on Saturday, February 4th. His Grace will be with us on that date, and Milan Visnick let us know that he will be presenting the Order of St. Sava award to Mark Rasevic.

We closed the annual meeting with a prayer at 3:20 pm.

2023 ANNUAL ASSEMBLY PRESIDENT'S REPORT

December 1, 2023

Dear Fellow Parishioners:

2023 continued as a growth year for our St. Luke parish. On behalf of the Trusteeship, I have the following to report regarding our status this year:

1. 2023 brought increased optimism and esprit de corps. Our community is experiencing growth in church attendance, stewardship, and participation in various activities and programs.

2. We are blessed with a baby boom.

3. All liturgical and special services continue to be livestreamed.

4. In January, we celebrated Christmas and an old calendar New Year's Eve celebration.

5. The St. Sava Akademija program and slava celebration, held on February 4, was a huge success and attendance exceeded previous years. We were honored to host our Bishop Irinej, Father Sava, Abbott of Dechani Monastery, Their Royal Highnesses Crown Prince Alexander and Princess Katherine, and the Ambassador of Serbia, His Excellency Marko Djuric.

6. Our parish was proud and overjoyed to have our lifelong member Mark Rasevic awarded the Order of Saint Sava by the Holy Synod. The highest award presented by the Serbian Orthodox Church was in recognition of Mark's elite level of vision, guidance, expertise, and accomplishment during his tenure as an officer of our parish Trusteeship from April 2010 to the present. Mark's leadership, hard work, and dedication led to the financing and building of our current church. The award

was presented to Mark by Bishop Irinej at our St. Sava Akademija program and slava celebration.

7. In February, we were visited by Bishop Grigorije of Dusseldorf and Germany. He served Hierarchical Divine Liturgy and delivered a lecture "Keep Your Mind in Hell and Do Not Despair."

8. Father Vasilije conducted lectures on our faith and is always available to minister to the individual needs of parishioners.

9. The Parish Assistance Committee stands ready to help our parishioners get groceries, prescriptions, etc. It can be contacted by emailing <u>outreach@svluka.org</u> or contacting Father Vasilije.

10. With the blessing of His Grace Bishop Irinej, there was a change in the audit committee. With the resignation of Miodrag Lazarevich, Peter Bizic was approved to join current member Marija Eremic. We thank Mio for his dedication and long service on the audit committee.

11. The church beautification project is being met with overwhelming participation. The iconostasis, throne for the healing Trojeručica icon, Bishop's throne, and new altar table arrived and have been installed in our church following the completion of needed construction modifications. We thank Ivan Ilijoski and his company for their outstanding job in handling all aspects of the installation.

12. In June and October, we held two very successful SerbFests. These fundraising events are critical to augment operating expenses. They also provide an excellent forum to share our culture with our community and a tremendous opportunity for our parishioners to work together for their church.

13. On June 25, we held a Vidovdan luncheon prepared by Danielle Sremac and her husband Milenko Bogajcevic, formerly of Kosovo. He addressed attendees about the significance of Vidovdan, how it is currently observed in Kosovo, and the conditions the residents must endure.

14. After Labor Day, we moved into high gear with activities:

• SerbFest was held the weekend of October 6.

- The Sunday religious education program, Serbian school, folklore, and children's choir resumed classes and practices. A welcome back picnic kicked off the new school year.
- The Kolo celebrated their slava and hosted a slava luncheon.
- On October 15, we hosted a screening of *Wireless*, the movie about Nikola Tesla.
- On October 20, we hosted a performance by the Diogen Folklore Ensemble. We thank Mima Marden for chairing this very successful event.
- On October 29, we celebrated our 62nd anniversary and church slava. Kumovi for this year's slava were Aleksandar Dukic and his wife Jelena Tasic. Next year's kumovi for our St. Luke slava will be Aleksandar Terzic and his wife Jasmina Milkovich. The day began with Hierarchical Divine Liturgy celebrated by His Grace Bishop Irinej, followed by a delicious Slava Luncheon prepared by our Kolo. We were entertained by Lira Choir, Lira Children's Choir, and Prelo, our children's folklore group.
- We held a Zurka on November 24 which was a financial and social success. We want to thank DC Electric Band for donating their talent for this event.

15. An account was established to receive funds collected for a new playground to replace the current one. The Trusteeship is looking for volunteers to chair this fundraising campaign.

16. We thank Mark Rasevic for leading a small team of volunteers who hosted a St. Luke food booth at the Ukrainian Festival in Baltimore. This initiative augmented our fundraising efforts.

17. We thank Ivana Ciric for accepting responsibility for coordinating Sunday Luncheons following Liturgy. We ask members of our parish to step up and volunteer to host a Sunday luncheon. This can be hosted individually or by a group and sign-up can be either on SignUp Genius or by contacting Ivana. Light refreshments are served after Liturgy on Sundays when there are no designated luncheons.

18. The committee structure that we implemented three years ago continues to provide more efficient board administration. Items are first vetted through the responsible committee and then brought before the board for final action or with interim updates. Those committees include:

- Building & Grounds
- Communications

- Events Management
- Loan & Finance

- Candle Making Business
- Strategic Planning
- Sunday Luncheons/Coffee

- Altar
- Bookstore
- Volunteer Recruitment

19. We commemorated all major Orthodox feast days – particularly the Feasts of St. Sava and St. Luke.

20. The parish auxiliary groups – Kolo Srpskih Sestara, the Bratstvo, SSS "Lira", Parish Religious Education Program, Lira Children's Choir, Prelo Folklore Group, Nikola Tesla Serbian School, and the Zmaj Youth Group – continue to do their good work to assist our church; the details of their activities are contained in separate reports (attached). I would like to thank all these groups for their supporting our parish and representing our faith and culture in an exemplary fashion.

21. The parish e-mail distribution list keeps growing and continues to be the primary means of communication in the parish; e-mail distribution lists also continue to be used by the parish auxiliary groups. Social media has grown significantly as a means of communication.

22. The mailing lists for the monthly donation envelopes and master mailing list continue to be updated. Please make sure that we have your current mailing address. Returned postal mail often incurs additional charges.

23. All parish communications continue to be posted on the website for access to all.

24. Policies and procedures to ensure compliance with Article 26 of the Uniform Rules & Regulations of the Serbian Orthodox Church in North & South America which were drafted and implemented in January 2011, continue to be the standards for structuring our work.

25. A stewardship plan with annual pledges for the ongoing care and maintenance of our parish and facilities was drafted and implemented in January 2011 and continues to be used. A pledge form for 2024 is included with this report package. Everyone is encouraged to participate.

26. The importance of personal stewardship cannot be over emphasized. It is a mechanism to show our commitment by pledging our financial support and sharing

the talents that God has blessed us with by volunteering and participating on committees and projects.

27. Candle Business – Continuing the process of making our own beeswax candles, and through the initiative of Dejan Bujak, it is importing candles from Serbia. A separate report is attached. We are hopeful that this business will create much-needed revenue for the parish. Thank you to Dejan and his team for all their work on this project.

28. After nine years in our current facility, our parish still continues to struggle to make ends meet financially. The parish leadership continues to explore ways to try and generate additional income and to control expenses, but **the single most important source of financial support must come directly from our parishioners. If you haven't set up recurring online donations** <u>via our website</u>, **please do so**. This ensures that our church receives consistent funding throughout the year, even when many of us are away for the summer.

29. The Trusteeship is committed to moving the leadership of this parish from a Trusteeship to an elected Board of Directors. Before this can happen, we must have the monthly funding gaps eliminated, build a financial reserve for contingencies and loan paydown, and a continued increase in demonstrated support and commitment to this parish by its parishioners. **Continued and increased participation in the life of our parish is vital to making this happen.**

30. Parish life is slowly returning to pre-COVID conditions. I encourage all parishioners to participate fully. Come to church, bring your children to Sunday School, join one of our parish groups, volunteer for an event – or even better yet – come to the parish leadership with a new idea which you would like to implement.

In closing, I would like to thank the members of the Trusteeship for their work on behalf of the parish and our Kolo for their unwavering support. But most importantly, I wish to recognize Proto Vasilije and Protinica Jelena for their six years of energetic and transformative service to this parish. They have selflessly shared their gifts and talents with us and made a profound difference in our spiritual health. May God bless them and grant them many more years with us!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the course of the past year, our community continued to normalize towards our parish life before 2020. We hosted two SerbFests, held a Zurkas, hosted a successful St. Sava celebration (including bringing Fr. Sava and Fr. Amfilohije from Viskoi Decani monastery to our parish) and celebrated the Slava of our parish - St. Luke. We continued our Church Beautification project, seeing the installation of our stunning iconostasis and church furniture during 2023.

Income:

With the Beautification project, it is vital to think of income in two ways:

- 1) Operational Income
- 2) Beautification Project Income

Operational income refers to essentially all income, except any donations or funds raised expressly for the Beautification project. This section will deal with only operational income, as the Beautification project will be discussed in detail below.

Fiscal Year operational 2023 income is broken out into the following categories:

Church Worship (Tasa/Candles/Bookstore):	\$188,172.53
Donations (In Memory/Building Fund/Slavas):	\$99,166.32
Social Events and Fundraisers:	\$216,109.26

Total operational income for Fiscal Year 2023 was \$503,448.11

In comparison to the previous fiscal year, operational income in fiscal year 2023 was significantly higher than fiscal year 2022. This is mostly driven by hosting two very successful SerbFests over the course of 2023. Church worship income was approximately \$20,000 lower in 2023 compared to the previous year, while donation income was slightly higher. These numbers highlight the importance of SerbFest to our parish - it is a necessary and critical source of income.

Expenses:

Just as with income, expenses must also be broken out into Operational and Beautification expenses. This section deals with operational expenses only.

Fiscal Year 2023 operational expenses break down as for	ollows:
Mortgage:	\$156,495.72
Administrative, Building, Maintenance:	\$197,897.08
Other Expenses and Events:	\$129,540.78
Liturgical Needs, Church Supplies, Candles:	\$12,973.89

Total operational expenses for Fiscal Year 2023 were **\$496,907.47**.

Over the course of 2023, continued inflation, higher insurance costs, and other unexpected maintenance events drove up our expenses, compared to that of 2022. Our expenses were higher also due to the hosting of many events of the course of the year, primarily SerbFest, which did not occur in 2022.

Church Beautification Project:

As previously mentioned, the Church Beautification project, remains separate from our operational budget, as the funds collected for this project will be used only for the beautification of our church. Further, no operational funds will be used towards towards the beautification project.

In fiscal year 2023 donations towards the Church Beautification project totaled \$43,528.60. Expenses towards the Church Beautification project were \$53,891.11. Most of the expenses realized towards this project were from donations collected in the previous year, as we completed phase one of this project (including the installation of the iconostasis and thrones, which were completed funded via parishioner donations in 2021).

As of November 30, 2023, there remains **\$68,257.88** in donations allocated for the Church Beautification project. These funds sit in a savings account at John Marshall Bank until needed in alignment with project milestones.

Trends and Reminders:

Cost-cutting measures and improvements have helped decrease our monthly operational expenses. However, we have seen Church Worship income decrease slightly year-over-year for two consecutive years. The church continues to have no viable savings and any financial cushion we can build in our Operating Accounts is depleted used to cover unexpected expenses, of which there are many, ranging from HVAC maintenance to kitchen equipment repairs and beyond.

Furthermore, we continue to experience very lean summer months, when most of our parishioners are on their summer vacations. During the summer of 2023, the parish was only able to sustain due to a successful Spring SerbFest. The proceeds from SerbFest continue to sustain us through the summer months when church attendance, donations, and income in general decline.

I would also like to take this opportunity to again remind everyone that our church needs you we cannot sustain our community without your support. Whether via donations, volunteering for events, or remembering us in your Holy prayers, we need YOU. Please remember our church however you can. No donation, no hours spent volunteering are too small. We cannot continue to serve the Serbian and Orthodox faithful of the greater Washington DC area without your help.

With thankfulness to God, I would like to express my sincere and deepest appreciation to all of our parishioners and friends who helped our church over the past year. Whether through donations, participating in Divine Services, or attending our fundraisers, your support has enabled us to keep our doors open for the Serbian Orthodox faithful in the Washington DC metropolitan area. Your continued support is vital for us to continue our mission. We are grateful for you.

May God Bless all of you during the Advent season and in the new year.

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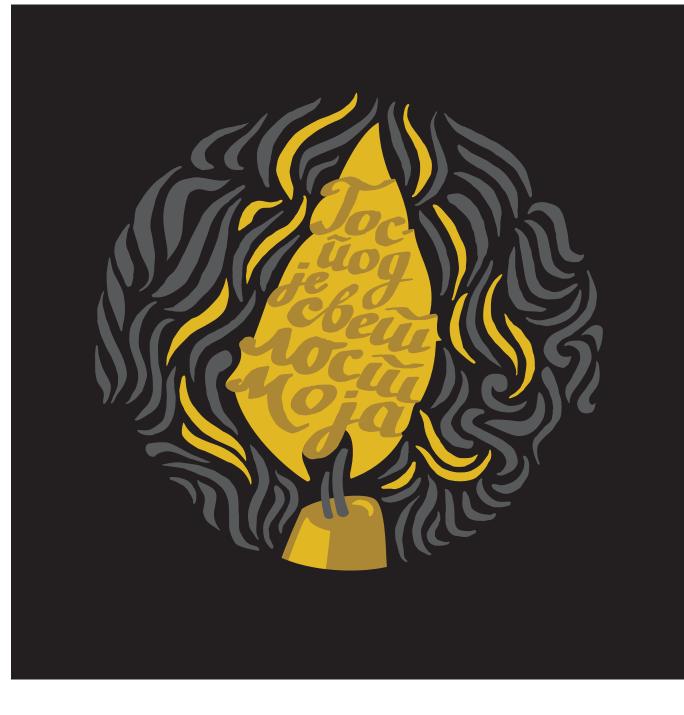

2023 Candle Shop Report

(Dec 2023, by Dejan Bujak)

Introduction

Our candleshop is established and works under the auspices of the St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church under the Serbian Orthodox Church Diocese of Eastern America and with the blessings of His Grace Bishop Irinej of Eastern America. We aim at providing a reliable supply of quality beeswax candles.

All profits are to benefit our St. Luke, Serbian Orthodox Church in Potomac, MD.

We are trying a new model by buying wholesale candles from Serbia to sell. We offer candle making workshops as a substitute for our own candle production.

Candles made by dipping method

This used to be our main technology for making candles. Right now we're using it only for our candlemaking monthly workshops.

Extraction (New) Machine

The machine is working well, we can make candles reliably. However, we do get 1 line of discoloration on candles, which doesn't make them uniform in color. Not a big deal for our church, but others might mind.

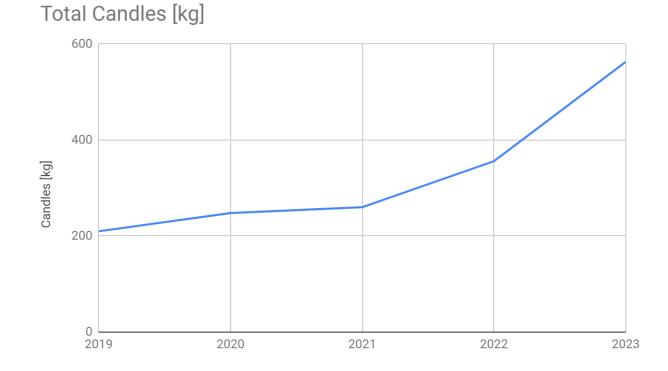
Candles from Serbia

This year we're trying a new model, that is to buy candles from Serbia and sell them here. This model is very attractive since it's not nearly labor intensive as is actual candle production. We purchased 1 ton of small candles of various sizes and 1 ton of Slava candles from Decani monastery. We've had a few churches that purchased these candles from us so far, unfortunately, we haven't had a lot of time to go and meet one-on-one with Washington, DC local Orthodox churches and to try to persuade them to buy candles from us.

Looking for help

For tracking purposes below are tasks from previous year/s and new ones we still need to accomplish. If you have experience in any of these please let us know.

1. Cleaning of frames for hand dipped candles.

After making hand dipped candles, metal frames have beeswax on them that needs to be cleaned before new candles can be made. Right now, we put these frames in the melter (we can pack 8 frames at the time) and it takes about 2 hrs for the wax to melt. So, it takes 8 hrs to clean 30 frames. We're hoping we could either:

- a. Connect all frames together and heat them up within minutes to above 70F so wax can melt and fall off. Could this be done using electricity?
- b. Build new frames using materials that would allow for quick cleaning.
- 2. Improve our hand dipped wicking machine. Please ask and we can show you the current design and suggested improvements.
- 3. We'll need somebody to help us figure out packing and shipping rates and set up a system for it.
- 4. We'll need a photographer and a web designer to build us a web site to sell candles.
- 5. If you can commit to regular volunteer hours for making candles please let us know.

Below is a list of other work we need help with:

- 1. Decorative candles. We could produce decorative candles which are much more profitable. If you have time to spearhead this effort please let us know.
- 2. We do recycle beeswax, we need help in turning out candles when they are close to the sand (if they get mixed with the sand very little to none can be recycled). Also, cleaning wax from the sand and melting it and getting it ready for production of new candles. We're also contemplating switching to containers with water instead of sand, so wax can be recycled much easier, help needed to design these containers and build them.
- 3. Need to weld some parts together, please let us know if you have welding experience.

2022 Summary

In 2023, we are trying a new model, that is to buy candles in Serbia and sell them in America, thus minimizing our labor. We've been able to sell to some churches, but are hoping with time the number of customers will increase.

Religious Education Annual Report

2023

Religious education has been ongoing at St. Luke for at least 40 years. During those years a succession of priests, teachers and students have come and gone. Also, during that span of time, life styles have changed among our parishioners and the number of activities that our families are participating in on Sundays has increased. Traditionally, Sunday School classes have been taught on Sundays in English following Liturgy. However, during the last two years, so many events have been scheduled after Liturgy that holding religious education classes has grown increasingly difficult. Coffee hour, luncheons, meetings, Serbian School, and children just taking a break outside have competed with holding Sunday School. Recently, Father Vasilije suggested a change in the schedule. Children will now meet in the church hall with their teachers during the Liturgy following the sermon and returning to church in time to receive Holy Communion. The approximate time of the start of this new schedule for classes is 10:40 am.

We have several new teachers who can teach on a rotating basis, depending on how many students are present and which age group they fall into. Students all receive a lesson sheet to take home and share with a parent as reinforcement of the day's learning. Themes for each lesson are selected from our curriculum. At present there are 15 children enrolled in our program, the lowest number of children in forty years. During the Covid pandemic when church was closed, we held classes via Zoom. This method was not successful for many reasons, and we returned eagerly to in-person class. We will continue with the new format for now and evaluate its effectiveness.

During this Advent period, I will be teaching an adult Sunday School class at 9:00 am in the church hall. Many adult parishioners have told me that they need to learn many things that they missed in their past. Our Orthodox Faith is beautiful, meaningful and practical for believers of all ages and backgrounds. Come and see.

The Serbian Singing Society Lira was established in 2018. This year marks our fifth anniversary, and with that, I am excited to report on a few successful activities this year.

Annual Kolo Report 2023

As in previous years, in 2023 the Kolo of Serbian Sisters continued to fulfill their mission of maintaining and promoting the Serbian Orthodox religion, tradition and culture, its values and identity by providing financial, moral, and social support to worthy projects.

In 2023 the fulfillment of this mission was made possible due to KSS's fundraising efforts. The first event this year was the celebration of our Serbian Christmas Eve (Badnje Vece). The Kolo continued its tradition of preparing a light meal consisting of baked beans, salad, pogaca, dried fruits, ceremonial loaf of bread with hidden coin (cesnica) and hot brandy (vruca rakija). The sisters also prepared advanced order Christmas Day dinners for sale consisting of gibanica, stuffed cabbage rolls (sarma), pickled pig's feet (pihtija), roasted meats (pecenje), and an assortment of cookies and pastries. The Kolo derived a nice income from sales of the pre-ordered Christmas dinners.

Also in January, the Kolo was busy joyfully preparing for the Saint Sava celebration held at Saints Peter and Paul Antiochian Church. The sisters were thrilled to be hosts to such important guests as His Grace Bishop Irinej of Eastern America, TRH Crown Prince Alexander and Crown Princess Katherine of Serbia, special guest Igoman Sava of Kosovo and Metohija as well as our own Mark Rasevic, Vice-President, who received the Order of Saint Sava for all of his tireless hard work and financial contributions towards all aspects of the building project of our St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church. This Slava was one of the most successful Slavas of our church parish. The attendance of this event was one of the largest ever, numbers exceeded 400 attendees. The Kolo was able to furnish a delicious meal for all in attendance as well as decorate the room beautifully.

The KSS also participated in community events such as the two very successful Serb Festivals, one held in the Spring and one in the Fall of 2023. As in past years, both festivals were attended by many people of different ethnic communities as well as from the Serbian community.

Although the post Covid years proved difficult to recruit volunteers to help with the festival preparations, this year was much better. A fair number of adult volunteers signed up offering their assistance as well as some Sunday school students who also look forward to helping serve the community in the future.

This year we were also blessed with the presence of His Grace Bishop Irinej for our Kolo Krsna Slava, Mala Gospojina, as well as for our church Patron Saint Slava, Holy Apostle and Evangelist Luke. His Grace Bishop Irinej celebrated the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy and blessed the kolac of both Slavas. Following the services, our Kolo of Serbian Sisters prepared a festive luncheon in our church hall.

The last fundraising event of the year, held in November, was the DC Zurka organized by parishioner, Nena Djokovic, with assistance from members of the KSS. All the attendees of the event enjoyed the music by DC band, who donated their services for the evening. A great time was had by all.

Some of the causes the Kolo supported financially in 2023 were the following: children's camp St. Sava in Shadeland, PA, Eastern Federation Kolo Board, monetary donation to Igoman Sava from Kosovo and Metohija for Soup Kitchens, St. Luke Slava Luncheon celebration.

Regardless of the uneventful Covid years, our Sisters have persevered and managed to keep the Kolo functioning and flourishing. We look forward to 2024 being the best year ever and to new members of all ages joining the organization.

Serbian School "Nikola Tesla" Annual Report for 2023 Prepared by Bojana Andrejvić and Ljiljana Becker

The Serbian school "Nikola Tesla" in Washington continues its successful work in its ninth year of existence. As before, the goal of the school is to preserve the Serbian language in our parish, as well as to familiarize Serbian children with Serbian history, culture and tradition. One of the additional goals of the school is to enable children and parents to socialize with each other, in order to further strengthen interpersonal relationships in the parish.

Classes are held every other Sunday from 1:00-3:00pm on the premises of the Church of St. Luke in Potomac. The break between two classes is 30 minutes, during which the children have a snack and time for free play in the church yard.

From 2022, the school collective has developed a special teaching program which, in addition to language (the first three years), includes other cultural and traditional activities such as singing traditional songs, religious studies (part of teaching at all levels) and folklore, but also traditional culinary and drama sections. For more information about the program, visit this <u>LINK</u>.

In addition to regular classes, during the school year, the teaching team also organizes workshops on making ornaments and decorating Christmas trees for Christmas, celebrating St. Sava in January, as well as painting eggs for Easter. The school year traditionally ends with the ceremonial awarding of diplomas and Serbian books to the children who attended classes during the year, with a joint celebration of the school's Slava of St. Emperor Constantine and Empress Jelena. On this occasion, the school organizes a celebration with a song and a theater performance.

Tuition for this school year is \$160 (\$20 x 8 months) per family, which covers the cost of consumables.

In the 2023/24 school year, we have 65 registered children on our list for live school attendance, although it is often the case that new children join later during the school year.

The children are currently gathered in 5 groups, according to age and level of knowledge of the Serbian language. During enrollment, each parent has the opportunity to declare their child's level of knowledge of the spoken and written Serbian language, which enables us to classify the children equally into groups. In the smallest group (3 to 5 years old), which we call the "Pacija school", we have 19 students, up from 24 last year. Teaching takes place through song and dance. We try to help children learn basic concepts and simple conversation in the Serbian language through interactive learning. At this age, in addition to the Serbian language class, children also attend folklore and singing classes. Middle group (6 to 8 years) so-called "Bukvar" is the most numerous (23 students), which is an increase from last year, when 14 students attended classes at this age. In this group, the main focus is on mastering the Cyrillic alphabet.

Older group (9 to 10 years) has 15 students, up from 9 last year. The middle (age 6-8) and older group (focus on practicing Cyrillic reading, age 9-10) have, in addition to Serbian language classes, also attend religious education classes.

In addition to these groups, we also have two older groups of students/teenagers, who regularly attend classes in the drama and culinary sections. Both groups are significantly smaller (between 4-6 students on average). These results are very encouraging for us because it is at this age that children begin to prioritize their American friendships and their obligations in American schools over Serbian schools.

Students regularly receive home assignments that they successfully master in advance. This practice has shown a significant improvement in class activity by students.

For all those who live far from the nearest Serbian school and are unable to travel, "Nikola Tesla" now offers virtual classes to Serbian children from the territory of the entire America, as well as the wider diaspora. A significant increase in interest was noted thanks to the support of the Embassy of the Republic of Serbia, which spread our proclamation throughout America. Currently, 35 students attend this type of teaching.

Our online program started as an offering during the pandemic, but to our surprise, former parishioners who currently live in other US states and around the world have joined us. For a long time, the problem was the number of teachers who could hold those classes, but now we have additional volunteers from the Faculty of Niš, which encouraged us to expand that initiative.

This year, the Serbian School in Washington received additional virtual support from lecturers/students of Serbian as a native language at the Faculty of Philosophy in Niš, who took their time to support this initiative for the preservation of the Serbian language and culture in the diaspora. It is this new partnership that is the best way to strengthen ties with the parent company. There is also the possibility of further expansion of a similar partnership with other universities, such as the University of Pristina, whose rector we contacted this fall, and there is also interest in cooperation from their side.

One of the challenges our school is currently facing is the lack of relevant literature for students, therefore our volunteers work diligently to develop literature and publish it. We are currently working on the creation of a history textbook, for which we would like to start a campaign to collect funds for its publication. More details will be presented during the annual week as part of the oral report.

We are extremely grateful to all our volunteer teachers, who work hard year after year to organize the school and develop the school program, as well as to all the parents who regularly bring their children to classes.

St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church Annual Audit Report

In accordance with the parish bylaws and Church constitution, an audit of the financial records for the St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church of Potomac, MD, was performed virtually from December 2, 2023, through December 6, 2023. The audit was performed by Marija Eremic and Peter Bizic, assisted by John Buffalini, Trusteeship Treasurer, by creating the files of the parish financial records. The reports provided to the audit team included the monthly bank records from United Bank and John Marshall bank, transaction details by month and event, major receipt copies, and answers to questions created from our initial review.

We performed the audit by reviewing the records for 12 months from November 2022 to October 2023 and associated receipts. We verified expenditures and gross receipts against the QuickBooks reports and found the receipts matched the summary records. All Church expenditures were fully documented and substantiated with appropriate receipts, including the review of all checking/savings accounts for the various church functions, compliant with accounting rules and appropriately authorized by the Trusteeship Board, in accordance with bylaws. We very much appreciate the work John put in to create the records for the Audit team, which is always very time-consuming and requires a big investment of personal time.

Our review revealed that the overall income (credits) at the end of the year (October 2023) generally met expenses (debits), and the ledgers were accurate in their accounting. We determined that the monthly collections combined with the special fund-raising events such as Christmas, St. Sava Celebration, DC Zurka, SerbFest and others exceeded expenses for the most part. We note that it was of significant benefit to our finances that we were able to resume SerbFest this year. While we focus on the financial aspects, it is important that all of us recognize that we cannot hold these fundraisers without the donation of people's time and labor which is equally important to our success.

We again note that progress continues with paying back some of the backlog of the monthly Diocesan Assessment contributions by our Parish to the Diocese. Our financial wellness, however, continues to require regular attention. While our parish continues to rise to the occasion in support of specific needs, such as our Beautification Fund, we note that in terms of our regular donations versus expenses (mortgage, clergy salary/benefits, utilities, etc.), we still struggle to keep our head above water and build up more general savings for the future benefit of our parish. We remind everyone again of the cyclical nature of our donations (particularly during the summer months when many people are away), while our monthly expenses remain constant. That said, we believe the Trustees are doing well in terms of managing our money and eliminating unnecessary expenditures. The audit team encourages our brothers and sisters in the parish via our prayers reflect, and please remember your Church as you go on vacation and set aside your donations ahead of time and donate or join the automatic donation from your credit cards or bank accounts.

Additionally, we also reviewed the status of the Sunday School, Serbian School, the Church Beautification Fund, and Altar expenses, and found that these ministries and activities are self-sustaining, all with positive balances in their individual checking accounts. In particular, as noted above, our parishioners have supported the Beautification Fund, and the work completed this year was fully funded and ample funds remain to continue with the planned improvements.

We also reviewed other the special events the Church Board had sponsored, such as Holiday celebrations for St. Sava and St. Luke Slava, and other fellowship activities. We recommend that we continue these events, for both social and fund-raising reasons. These events have created much needed fellowship amongst the church community, and again are self-sustaining. We pray for continued improvement in the health of our parish, so that we may continue to improve the spiritual and social well-being of our church community.

We also discussed with the Trusteeship the issue of the personal loans made to the Church by many of our parishioners and that the terms of the loans will be coming due. The audit team wants to thank all of our parishioners that have foregone interest payments as an additional effort of charity. We have encouraged the Trustees to engage with the parishioners regarding these loans as soon as possible so we are best able to manage repayments, etc. with our cash flow. We also note the smart decision to retain the majority of the funds from our government EIDL loan obtained during the pandemic, as a buffer to potentially help manage this or other needs as they might arise. The loan is a 30-year term and is on delayed repayment, so it is well within our current abilities to manage.

Finally, as we do every year, we continue to encourage others in our greater Serbian community to join in and pledge support to help the St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church grow to meet their collective spiritual needs and our faith. As we continue to return to normalcy post-pandemic, keeping our Church's financial picture healthy, as well as each other, builds upon the progress we've made in building up our culture, our faith, and our ability to leave a legacy for our children to enjoy now and in the future.
