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Annual Assembly Minutes December 10, 2023

The annual meeting was called to order with a prayer at 1:27pm. The meeting was held in person in the Church Social Hall.

Opening Remarks. Trusteeship President, Milan Visnick, opened the meeting, welcoming those in attendance. Copies of the agenda and all reports (see attached) were distributed at the meeting and made available on-line.


Previous Year's Minutes. The reading of minutes from last year was waived.

<u>Priest's Report.</u> Father Vasilije's gave his report. He highlighted that our parish has a unique privilege to build our own church, and he would like to thank everyone for their generosity in doing this.

Liturgical Life: Father's report included all the liturgical events we had in 2023. We celebrated the Divine Liturgy 140 times. There were 14 baptisms, 1 marriage, 1 conversion and 2 deaths.

Church Events. Since the last Annual Assembly, we had 56 notable events in our parish, all of which can be found on our Flickr page. Som notable highlights were Father Sava, Abbott of Decani Monastery; Bishop Grigorije of Dusseldorf and Germany; SSS Lira induction into Serbian Singing Federation; SSS trip to Aliquippa, PA; Beatification items installed; and two Serbfests after a hiatus.

Church Beautification Project. In 2023, we installed the Iconostasis. We would like to thank Mark Rasevic for storing our items from Serbia until we could install them. We also installed the Throne of the Bishop, the Throne of the Mother of God, the Altar table, and the Pevnica. Thank you to Jelena Tasic and Aleksandar Dukic for the iconostasis, Throne for the Mother of God and pevnica; thank you to Dejan Bujak for the altar table; and thank you to the Kolo for the Throne for the Bishop. We would like to thank Goran Milosavljevic for making the crates, doing the paperwork and organizing everything for transport. Thank you to Drina Rajic and the Office of the Republic of Srpska for donating the new altar curtain, altar cover and icon of St. Stephen the Archdeacon. We acquired a new reliquary of St. Thekla and St. Barbara. The pilgrimage group commissioned the




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reliquary. For 2024, we hope to do the next phase of ceiling frescoes; obtain a reliquary for St. George, St. Demetrius, and St. Theodor Tiron; and get new icons for veneration through parishioner donation and commissions.

Thank you to the Circle of Serbian Sisters, SSS Lira, Children's Choir, Sunday School/Religious Education; Serbian School "Nikola Tesla," "Prelo" Folklore, bookstore, candle shop, Zurka organizers, and brojanica workshops. Thank you to all the parish support we receive particularly from Igor Miletic, Dejan Bujak, Milena Mijuskovic, Snezana Djokic, Rada Bozic, Protonica Jelena, Ronald Butts-Boehner, Sunday School teachers and altar servers.

President's Report. Milan Visnick summarized highlights from the President's Report. Milan's report is available online. If anyone has any questions, please do not hesitate to reach out to Milan. 2023 continued as a growth year for our St. Luke parish. There was an increased optimism and spirit de corps. Our Community is experiencing growth in church attendance, stewardship, and participation in various activities and programs. We were blessed with a baby boom. Our parish was proud and overjoyed to have our lifelong member, Mark Rasevic, awarded the Order of St. Sava by the Holy Synod. The Parish Assistance Committee stands ready to help our parishioners get groceries, prescriptions, etc. It can be contacted by emailing outreach@svluka.org or contacting Father Vasilije. With the blessing of His Grace Biship Irinej, there was a change in the audit committee; with the resignation of Miodrag Lazarevich, Peter Bizic was approved to join current member Marija Eremic. An account was established to receive funds collected for a new playground to replace the current one. The Trusteeship is looking for volunteers to chair this fundraising campaign. Please make sure that we have your current mailing address. A stewardship pledge from for 2024 is included with this report package. Everyone is encouraged to participate. The importance of personal stewardship cannot be over emphasized. It is a mechanism to show our commitment by pledging our financial support and sharing the talents that God has blessed us with by volunteering and participating on



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committees and projects. After nine years in our current facility, our parish still continues to struggle to make ends meet financially. The parish leadership continues to explore ways to try and generate additional income and to control expenses, but the single most important source of financial support must come directly form our parishioners. If you haven't set up recurring online donations via our website, please do so. The Trusteeship is committed to moving the leadership of the parish from a Trusteeship to an elected Board of Directors, but before this can happen, we must have the monthly funding gaps eliminated, build a financial reserve for contingencies and loan paydown, and a continued increase in demonstrated support and commitment to this parish by its parishioners. Thank you to the members of the Trusteeship for their work on behalf of the parish and our Kolo for their unwavering support. Thank you to Zoran Stanisic and Donald Fish for being our tudors. Most importantly, thank you to Proto Vasilje and Protonica Jelena for their six years of energetic and transformative service to this parish. May God bless them and grant them many more years with us.


<u>Treasurer's Report</u>. John Buffalini presented the Treasurer's Report, including a summary of the year's major financial happenings, a review of the fiscal year-to-date income and expenses, trends, and anticipated 2023 income versus proposed budget expenditures.

Income. Our income has consisted of two parts – Operational Income and Beautification Income. Our operational income for the year was \$503,448. Our 2023 fiscal year operational income was significantly higher than fiscal year 2022, which was heavily driven by hosting two very successful SerbFests.

Expenses. Our total operational expenses were \$496,907. Our expenses were higher than the previous year due to continued inflation, higher insurance costs, and other unexpected maintenance events. Our expenses were also higher due to the hosting of many events over the course of the year.

Church Beautification Project. Donations for the Church Beautification project totaled \$43,529 and expenses totaled \$53,891. Most of the expenses realized towards this project were from donations collected in the previous year. As of November 30,2023, we have \$68,258 funds remaining.

Trends and Reminders. Cost-cutting measures and improvements have helped decrease our monthly operational expenses. However, we have seen Church Worship income decrease slightly year-over-year for two consecutive years. The church continues to have



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no viable savings and any financial cushion we can build in our Operating Accounts is depleted to cover unexpected expenses. Furthermore, we continue to experience very lean summer months.

<u>Other Reports</u>. Next, reports were presented or submitted by the leads of the following parish auxiliary organizations— Audit Board (Marija Eremic), Candle Shop (Dejan Bujak), Sunday School (Joyce Visnick), Serbian Singing Society "Lira" (Nevena Arizanovic), Children's Choir (Protonica Jelena Vranic), Circle of Serbian Sisters (Nina Lojanica – presented by Joyce Visnick), Serbian School "Nikola Tesla" (Bojana Andrejvic) and Folklore Group "Prelo" (Rada Bozic). All reports were distributed at the meeting and made available on-line, and parishioners had the opportunity to ask questions of all the leads.

New Business; Other Questions & Answers. None at this time

We closed the annual meeting with a prayer at 4:10 pm.



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2024 ANNUAL ASSEMBLY PRESIDENT'S REPORT

December 14, 2024

Dear Fellow Parishioners:

2024 continued as a growth year for our St. Luke parish. On behalf of the Trusteeship, I have the following to report regarding our status this year:

1. 2024 brought increased optimism and esprit de corps. Our community continues to experience growth in church attendance, stewardship, and participation in various activities and programs.

2. We are blessed with a continued baby boom.

3. All liturgical and special services continue to be livestreamed.

4. In January, we celebrated Christmas.

5. The St. Sava Akademija program and slava celebration, held on February 3, was a huge success and attendance exceeded previous years. We were honored to host our Bishop Irinej, the Ambassador of Serbia, His Excellency Marko Djuric, and keynote speaker, Mr. David Vuich.

6. Father Vasilije continued to conduct lectures on our faith and made himself available to minister to the individual needs of parishioners.

7. The Parish Assistance Committee is still operational and stands ready to help our parishioners get groceries, prescriptions, etc. It can be contacted by emailing <u>outreach@svluka.org</u> or contacting Father Vasilije. 8. There was a change in the audit committee for this year. Marie Kosanovich and Dana Isailovic Novacic joined current member Marija Eremic to conduct the 2024 Audit.

9. The Church Beautification Project has been met with overwhelming enthusiastic participation. Phase 2 will be installed beginning December 24 and will be completed in time for our Christmas. We thank Aleksandar Terzic and Aleksandar Krsmanovic for their efforts in spearheading the fund-raising campaign for Phase 2.

10. In May and October, we held two very successful SerbFests. These fundraising events are critical to augment operating expenses. They also provide an excellent forum to share our culture with our community and a tremendous opportunity for our parishioners to work together for their church and have fun doing so!

11. On June 30, we held a Vidovdan luncheon prepared by our Kolo followed by a presentation by our parishioner, Branko Terzic. Fortunately for us, his outstanding lesson was videotaped for everyone to see.

12. After Labor Day, we moved into high gear with activities:

- SerbFest was held the weekend of October 5.
- The Sunday religious education program, Serbian school, folklore, and children's choir resumed classes and practices.
- The Kolo celebrated their slava and hosted a slava luncheon.
- On November 3, we celebrated our 63rd anniversary and church slava. Kumovi for this year's slava were Aleksandar Terzic and his wife Jasmina Milkovich. The day began with Hierarchical Divine Liturgy celebrated by His Grace Bishop Irinej, followed by a delicious Slava Luncheon prepared by our Kolo. We were entertained by Lira Choir, Lira Children's Choir, and Prelo, our children's folklore group.

13. Funds were raised to build a new playground for our parish's growing number of children. The old playground was removed, and the new playground was installed by volunteers of our parish. We thank Aleksandar Krsmanovic for spearheading this effort.

14. We recognize and thank Mark Rasevic for leading a small team of volunteers who hosted a St. Luke food booth at the Balkan Chestnut Festival in Southern Maryland. This initiative augmented our fundraising efforts.

15. This fall, we re-started one of our past fundraisers – the New-To-You Sale. We would like to thank Ivana Ciric and Ljiljana Becker for their help in organizing & executing this fundraiser.

16. We recognize and thank Ivana Ciric for coordinating Sunday Luncheons following Liturgy. The luncheons have made such a positive contribution to the building camaraderie among our parish families. We invite members of our parish to step up and volunteer to host a Sunday luncheon. This can be hosted individually or by a group and sign-up can be either on SignUp Genius or by contacting Milos Lazic. Light refreshments are served after Liturgy on Sundays when there are no designated luncheons.

17. The committee structure that we implemented three years ago continues to provide more efficient board administration. Items are first vetted through the responsible committee and then brought before the board for final action or with interim updates. Those committees include:

- Building & Grounds
- Communications
- Events Management
- Loan & Finance
- Candle Making Business

- Strategic Planning
- Sunday Luncheons/Coffee
- Altar
- Bookstore
- Volunteer Recruitment

18. We commemorated all major Orthodox feast days – particularly the Feasts of St. Sava and St. Luke. Recognition and thanks go to Fr. Vasilije.

19. We recognize and thank Zoran Stanisic and Donald Fish for steadfastly being Tutors at all services they attend.

20. The parish auxiliary groups – Kolo Srpskih Sestara, the Bratstvo, SSS "Lira", Parish Religious Education Program, Lira Children's Choir, Prelo Folklore Group, Nikola Tesla Serbian School, and the Zmaj Youth Group – continue to do their good work to assist our church; the details of their activities are contained in separate reports (attached). I would like to thank all these groups for their supporting our parish and representing our faith and culture in an exemplary fashion.

21. The parish e-mail distribution list keeps growing and continues to be the primary means of communication in the parish; e-mail distribution lists also

continue to be used by the parish auxiliary groups. Social media has grown significantly as a means of communication.

22. The mailing lists for the monthly donation envelopes and master mailing list continue to be updated.

- Please make sure that we have your current mailing address. Returned postal mail incurs additional charges.
- If you contribute electronically and no longer use the monthly donation envelopes, **please let us know** so that we can discontinue sending you envelopes.

23. All parish communications continue to be posted on the website for access to all.

24. Policies and procedures to ensure compliance with Article 26 of the Uniform Rules & Regulations of the Serbian Orthodox Church in North & South America which were drafted and implemented in January 2011, continue to be the standards for structuring our work.

25. A stewardship plan with annual pledges for the ongoing care and maintenance of our parish and facilities was drafted and implemented in January 2011 and continues to be used. A pledge form for 2025 is included with this report package and will be available electronically. Everyone is encouraged to participate. It is also the basis for determining eligibility to vote on critical matters when required.

26. The importance of personal stewardship cannot be over emphasized. It is a mechanism to show our commitment by pledging our financial support and sharing the talents that God has blessed us with by volunteering and participating on committees and projects.

27. Candle Business ceased operations this past fall. It is no longer making or importing candles from Serbia. A separate report is attached. Thank you to Dejan Bujak and his team for all their work on this project for many years!

28. After ten years in our current facility, our parish still continues to struggle to make ends meet financially. The parish leadership continues to explore ways to try and generate additional income and to control expenses, but **the single most important source of financial support must come directly from our parishioners. If you haven't set up recurring online donations** <u>via our website</u>,

please do so. This ensures that our church receives consistent funding throughout the year, even when many of us are away for the summer.

29. The Trusteeship is committed to moving the leadership of this parish from a Trusteeship to an elected Executive Board. Before this can happen, we must have the monthly funding gaps eliminated, build a financial reserve for contingencies and loan paydown, and a continued increase in demonstrated support and commitment to this parish by its parishioners. **Continued and increased participation in the life of our parish is vital to making this happen.**

30. All parishioners are encouraged to participate fully. Come to church, bring your children to Sunday School, join one of our parish groups, volunteer for an event – or even better yet – join one of the standing committees or come to the parish leadership with a new idea which you would like to implement.

31. The Trusteeship wants to hear from anyone interested in serving on the Trusteeship in the future.

In closing, I would like to thank the members of the Trusteeship for their work on behalf of the parish and our Kolo for their unwavering support. But most importantly, I wish to recognize Proto Vasilije and Protinica Jelena for their seven years of energetic and transformative service to this parish. They have selflessly shared their gifts and talents with us and made a profound difference in our spiritual health. May God bless them and grant them many more years with us!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the course of the past year, our community was very active with many events, in addition to a very busy Liturgical life within our parish. We held our typical keystone events such as SerbFest and Svetosavska Akademija, but also reintroduced other fundraisers, such as the Newto-You Sale. We continued our Church Beautification project, culminating with the installation of frescoes in the Nave of our church in December 2024.

Income:

With the Beautification project, it is vital to think of income in two ways:

- 1) Operational Income
- 2) Beautification Project Income

Operational income refers to essentially all income, except any donations or funds raised expressly for the Beautification project. This section will deal with only operational income, as the Beautification project will be discussed in detail below.

Fiscal Year operational 2024 income is broken out into the following categories:

Church Worship (Tasa/Candles/Bookstore):	\$218,448.04
Donations (In Memory/Building Fund/Slavas):	\$106,870.59
Social Events and Fundraisers:	\$233,563.18

Total operational income for Fiscal Year 2024 was **\$558,881.81**

In comparison to the trend we've realized over the previous fiscal years, operational income in fiscal year 2024 was significantly (approx. \$55,000) higher than fiscal year 2023. Income was higher across all categories when compared to the previous fiscal year. A record-setting income realized at our fall 2024 SerbFest is part of our 2024 success story. Nevertheless, SerbFest remains of great importance to our parish - it is a necessary and critical source of income.

Expenses:

Just as with income, expenses must also be broken out into Operational and Beautification expenses. This section deals with operational expenses only.

Fiscal Year 2024 operational expenses break down as for	ollows:
Mortgage:	\$169,561.86
Administrative, Building, Maintenance:	\$252,595.69
Other Expenses and Events:	\$81,929.35
Liturgical Needs, Church Supplies, Candles:	\$16,914.60

Total operational expenses for Fiscal Year 2024 were **\$521,001.50**.

As such, the operational profit for Fiscal Year 2024 was \$38,880.31.

Over the course of 2024, continued inflation, higher insurance costs, and other unexpected maintenance events drove up our expenses, compared to that of 2023.

Additionally, the Trusteeship took steps to repay all Parishioner Loans which had been on the books since 2019. As of November 30, 2024, all Parishioner Loans have either been repaid or converted into a donation to the church.

Church Beautification Project:

As previously mentioned, the Church Beautification project, remains separate from our operational budget, as the funds collected for this project will be used only for the beautification of our church. Further, no operational funds will be used towards towards the beautification project.

In fiscal year 2024 donations towards the Church Beautification project totaled \$99,329.43. Expenses towards the Church Beautification project were \$93,305.61.

As of November 30, 2024, there remains **\$74,756.70** in donations allocated for the Church Beautification project. These funds sit in a savings account until needed, in alignment with project milestones.

Trends and Reminders:

Cost-cutting measures and improvements have helped decrease our monthly operational expenses. However, our church continues to have minimal savings and any financial cushion we can build in our Operating Accounts is generally depleted to cover unexpected expenses, of which there are many, ranging from HVAC maintenance to kitchen equipment repairs and beyond.

Furthermore, we continue to experience very lean summer months, when most of our parishioners are on their summer vacations. During the summer of 2024, the parish was only able to sustain due to a successful Spring SerbFest. The proceeds from SerbFest continue to sustain us through the summer months when church attendance, donations, and income in general decline.

Also of note in 2024, the interest rate on our loan with John Marshall Bank reset per the terms of our loan agreement, executed in May 2019. Our new interest rate is 7.25% and our new monthly mortgage payment is \$15,219 per month. This is an increase of \$2,178 per month (\$26,136 per year). As a parish, we will need to be extra diligent to ensure that our income remains at a level where we will be able to meet our monthly loan payment.

I would also like to take this opportunity to again remind everyone that our church needs you we cannot sustain our community without your support. Whether via donations, volunteering for events, or remembering us in your Holy prayers, we need YOU. Please remember our church however you can. No donation, no hours spent volunteering are too small. We cannot continue to serve the Serbian and Orthodox faithful of the greater Washington DC area without your help.

With thankfulness to God, I would like to express my sincere and deepest appreciation to all of our parishioners and friends who helped our church over the past year. Whether through donations, participating in Divine Services, or attending our fundraisers, your support has enabled us to keep our doors open for the Serbian Orthodox faithful in the Washington DC metropolitan area. Your continued support is vital for us to continue our mission. We are grateful for you.

May God Bless all of you during the Advent season and in the new year.





2024 Candle Shop Report

(Dec 2024, by Dejan Bujak)

Closing the Operation...

Since 2018, we've been trying to acquire technology to produce enough candles to sell to all the churches in the Easter Diocese.

After many tries and tribulations to bring out our own production to a satisfactory level and never quite succeeding - we decided to import enough candles made in Serbia and to see how many churches in our Diocese would start regularly buying candles from us.

We were trying very hard to market our products by:

- Word of mouth
- Sending out sample candles
- Sending out emails
- Calling and networking
- Going to Shadeland final week (where a lot of parish priests are present)

While we had some success and were able to sell a few hundred kilos of candles, it was all "one-off" and we haven't acquired regular (recurring) customers.

In 2024, it was decided and approved by the Trusteeship that the candle making shop can close the operation and **the space can be given back for church use**. Of course, current candle inventory will remain there until it is consumed in the next few years by our church.

All the investments by Dejan Bujak, Viktor Isailovic and Milutin Djurickovic were converted as their individual donations to our Church, so no money is owed to anybody. Money from selling off the equipment and candles will go directly to our Church.

Looking for help

At this point we need to try and sell outstanding items stored in the storage room:

- Frames for making candles by dipping method (30 frames for small candles and 5 frames for Slava candles).
- Two Custom made pots for dipping frames.
- Wax melting machine.
- Some wix.
- Some packing materials.
- Other smaller tools and items we used while making candles.

Finally once all the items are removed, we'd need to organize shelves with the remaining candle inventory, clean the floor and turn it back over to the Church.

2024

Religious Education is an ongoing ministry in our church. Presently 38 children are enrolled in the program, compared to just 15 last year, a jump of 150%. Last summer our Bishop Irinej launched a new effort to standardize the religious instruction of students in every parish in the Eastern Diocese. He appointed a special commission early in 2023 to study various curricula and well-developed lessons that had been published by respected Orthodox sources. After thoughtful deliberation, the choice of Orthodox Journeys was made and presented to all the religious education teachers throughout the diocese. The lessons are accessed online weekly and are written for students K-2, 3-5, 6-8 and 9-12. The same topic is presented each week and designed to reach each child's appropriate level. In our parish, on a trial basis, we decided to send out the lessons each week to all parents who signed up for their children to receive religious instruction. Of course, it fell to parents of young children and to the older students themselves to download the materials, read them and to discuss them at home. After a meeting with some students and a few parents on December 1st, held to evaluate how the program was progressing, it became clear that this online lesson model was not working as we had hoped. The older students did not read the materials, and the younger students did not accept the teaching from their parents. The consensus of both adults and children who attended the meeting was that we should return to in-person classes with a teacher leading the instruction and discussion upstairs following Liturgy on Sundays. I have not heard from any parents who are satisfied with the new online lesson model.

It certainly is possible to return to classical in-person classes. If we do return to this delivery model, it will require parents to do three things:

1. Bring your child (children) to Church.

2. Send him or her upstairs for religious education instruction after Liturgy. In some cases, walk with your child upstairs.

3. Review any lesson handouts given either in person or online with your child, just as you do with their regular homework in M-F school.

I will continue to send out weekly lessons online to accommodate out-of-town students and adults who are on the distribution list. We here at St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church stand ready to instruct the parish children in the Orthodox Christian faith. Parents, will you partner with us to make this happen?

President's Report 2024

The Serbian Singing Society Lira is tremendously grateful to our singers and our conductor, p. Jelena Vranic, who together show gratitude to God and commitment to serving our parish community and beyond.

Presently we are up to thirty singers who regularly sing responses at the Sunday Divine Liturgies at our St. Luke's church. Most weeks we have a robust number of both men and women in attendance, as well as teens, helping to achieve a full sound and contribute to the beauty of everyone's worship experience. The choir proceeds to incorporate new arrangements of Orthodox liturgical music, and we hope that most of our congregation will learn to sing them alongside the choir, over time. We also welcomed new singers who are working hard to learn the repertoire and master the skill of choral singing.

Some activities took place outside of worship as well, nevertheless inspired and strengthened by the spirit of worship, which are essential for the life of the Lira choir, such as an appearance at Serb Fests, St. Sava Slava celebration, as well as supporting our parishioners in their milestone and special events by singing for a baptism, a wedding, and funerals (Branko's baptism, Dajana & John wedding, Snezana and Karmela's funeral etc.)

This year SSF Lira was invited to be an honor choir at the Serbian Singing Federation Festival which took place over Memorial Day weekend in Windsor, Canada. Eighteen Lira singers proudly presented our parish at the festival and corresponded to the Sunday liturgy.

Additionally, our board's vice president Dejan Bujak attended and represented Lira at the Serbian Singing Federation's Convention which took place this past September in San Diego, CA.

After many years of service on Lira's board (various positions), Matthew Marcetich stepped down from his position as Vice President - thank you so much for your service, Matthew! We updated our by-laws at our annual meeting and had an election (elected officers as follows: President: Nevena Arizanovic, Vice-President: Dejan Bujak, Treasurer: Jasmina Milkovic, Secretary: Marie Kosanovic). The Board meets at least once a month (open to the public) except for skipping a month during summer. The Board has worked together to think creatively and become more reflective of the choir's needs and has worked diligently on making the choir sustainable and proactive in our church community. We made new fundraising efforts by preparing Sunday after-liturgy lunches and have collected funds toward beautifying the church with the medallion of Patriarch Pavle of Serbia (\$1,250), one of the great masters of Serbian church chant and a great Liturgist of our current times.

We are currently in full preparation for our first annual concert scheduled for February 21-23, 2024, where our kumovi choir Branko Radichevich from Chicago is our honorary guest performer. This is going to be a landmark event for our choir, and we hope to have all of you support us in our efforts and come together for this joyful weekend.

I am grateful to p. Jelena for continuing to be our amazing choir director, to the board members of the choir for their hard work and support throughout the year, and most of all to the singers of the choir who dedicate their valuable time and energy to making our services more beautiful each week.

Finally, we would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to the "Serbian Brothers" (Marko, Miloš, Peđa, Sava, and others) for their invaluable help and support, without which our success would not have been possible.

We look forward to an even more prosperous year ahead, the growth of KSS, and the exciting challenges and celebrations to come!

Званични извештај о раду Српске школе "Никола Тесла" у Вашингтону

2024/2025

Српска школа "Никола Тесла" у Вашингтону наставља са успешним радом и у деветој години постојања. Као и до сада циљ школе је одржавање српског језика у нашој парохији као и упознавање српске деце са српском историјом, културом и традицијом. Поред тога, још један од циљева школе је омогућавање деци као и родитељима да се међусобно друже и на тај начин додатно учвршћују међуљудске везе у парохији.

Часови се одржавају сваке друге недеље од 13:30-15:30 у просторијама Цркве Свети Лука у Потомку. Одмор између два часа је 30 минута, током којег деца имају ужину и време за слободну игру у Црквеном дворишту.

Поред редовне наставе на часу, деца такође учествују и у другим додатним активностима као што су веронаука, драмска секција и радионице очувања српске традиције (фолклора, часова традиционалног кувања, прављења украса и кићење Бадњака, фарбање јаја за Ускрс, прављење венаца за Врбице и друго). Школска година се завршава заједничком прославом школске славе Свети цар Константин и царица Јелена и школском представом ђака школе. Школарина за ову школску годину је подигнута по први пут након више од 5 година са \$160 на \$200 за породице са једним дететом, односно \$225 за породице са више деце. Циљ је да \$160 (\$20 x 8 месеци), као и до сада покрива трошкове школског материјала, док преосталих \$40, односно \$65, представља донацију цркви, а као резултат ове промене, школа ће цркви донирати чек од \$3000.

Ове 2024/25 године пријављено је 84 деце за похађање школе, што је рекордни број до сада, и скок од 19 пријава од само прошле године (65 деце у 2023/2024).

Ъаци су подељени у више група, по узрасту и нивоу знања српског језика. За више информација о наставном садржају, погледајте план и програм наставе у прилогу овог извештаја. Наставни план и програм настао је у договору са наставницима и на основу запажања о интересовању ђака на часу и активно се примењује од 2022. године. Сви ученици редовно добијају и домаће задатке које успешно савладавају.

Од 2022. године, након пандемије, а уз сарадњу и подршку студената волонтера из Србије, оформили смо и виртуелну наставу Српске школе Никола Тесла која прати исти школски програм. Циљ је да и деци која станују далеко од цркве пружимо прилику да наставе своје школовање на српском језику. Official Report on the Work of the Serbian School "Nikola Tesla" in Washington

2024/2025

The Serbian School "Nikola Tesla" in Washington continues its successful work in its ninth year of existence. As before, the goal of the school is to maintain the Serbian language in our parish and to introduce Serbian children to Serbian history, culture and tradition. In addition, another goal of the school is to enable children and parents to socialize with each other and thus further strengthen interpersonal ties in the parish.

Classes are held every other Sunday from 1:30 PM to 3:30 PM in the premises of the St. Luke Church in Potomac. The break between two classes is 30 minutes, during which children have a snack and time for free play in the Church yard.

In addition to regular classes, children also participate in other additional activities such as a religious study, drama section and workshops to preserve Serbian traditions (folklore, traditional cooking classes, making decorations and decorating the Christmas tree, dyeing eggs for Easter, making wreaths for Vrbice, and more). The school year ends with a joint celebration of the school's slava of Saint Emperor Constantine and Empress Helena and a school play by school students. Tuition for this school year has been raised for the first time in more than 5 years from \$160 to \$200 for families with one child, or \$225 for families with more than one child. The goal is that \$160 (\$20 x 8 months), as before, covers the cost of school materials, while the remaining \$40, or \$65, is a donation to the church, and as a result of this change, the school will donate a check for \$3,000 to the church.

This 2024/25 school year, 84 children were registered to attend the school, which is a record number so far, and a jump of 19 applications from last year alone (65 children in 2023/2024).

Students are divided into several groups, by age and level of knowledge of the Serbian language. For more information about the teaching content, see the curriculum attached to this report. The curriculum was created in agreement with teachers and based on observations of students' interest in the class and has been actively implemented since 2022. All students also regularly receive homework that they successfully complete.

Since 2022, after the pandemic, and with the cooperation and support of student volunteers from Serbia, we have also established virtual classes at the Serbian School Nikola Tesla, which follows the same school program. The goal is to provide children who live far from the church with the opportunity to continue their education in the Serbian language. Last year, 20 students successfully completed the school year, and this year we have 26 children enrolled.

We are extremely grateful to all our volunteer teachers, who work hard year after year to organize the school and develop the school program, as well as to all parents who regularly bring their children to classes.

At our fall Serbfest the children's group performed the choreography "Srbija" featuring dances from Sumadija performed by our youngest group, dances from Lescovac performed by our middle group, and dances from East Serbia performed by our oldest group. The folklore group also danced for Slava Sveti Luka, performing both the "Srbija" choreography as well as "Urban Dances From Serbia". This school year the children's folklore group has 24 dancers. The children's group practices every Friday, and we are planning to start recreational practices for adults.

St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church Annual Audit Report

December 20, 2024

In accordance with the parish bylaws and Church constitution, an audit of the financial records for the St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church of Potomac, MD was performed virtually the week of 16 December 2024. The audit was performed by Marija Eremic, Danica Novacic, and Marie Kosanovich with the assistance and guidance of John Buffalini, Trusteeship Treasurer, by creating the files of the parish financial records. The reports provided to the audit team included monthly bank statements from United Bank and John Marshall Bank, transaction details by month and event, major receipt copies, and answers to questions created as a result of our initial review.

We performed the audit by reviewing the records for 12 months from November 2023 to October 2024 and associated receipts. We verified expenditures and gross receipts against the Quickbooks reports and found the receipts matched the summary records. All church expenditures were fully documented and substantiated with appropriate receipts, including the review of all checking and savings accounts for the various church functions, compliant with accounting rules and appropriately authorized by the Trusteeship Board, in accordance with bylaws. The audit committee can tell that the amount of work John puts in for the Trusteeship and the Church at large is certainly a labor of love. The time he dedicates to his Church and for his faith are evident and greatly appreciated.

Our review revealed that the overall income (credits) at the end of the year (October 2024) generally met expenses (debits) and the ledgers were accurate in their accounting. There were a few key events that took place during our review period that are worth mentioning in more detail.

- SerbFest continues to generate a substantial amount of profit and is critical to the financial health of the church. We must also recognize that without the donation of the parishioners' time and labor, these events would not be possible.
- The terms of the parishioner loans that were made in May 2019 came to fruition this year and were paid off in May and June with some parishioners opting to turn their loan into a donation. We greatly appreciate those who generously participated in this program.
- The Beautification project specifically the frescoes for the walls and ceiling of the church began this year. Funds that are being raised for this project have outpaced the expenses, though some of the final payments will be made upon completion in 2025. We encourage the Trusteeship to continue providing updates on this effort with the hopes of raising more funds into the next year.

Additionally, we reviewed the status of the Sunday School, Serbian School, and Altar expenses and found that these ministries and activities are all self-sustaining, all with positive balances in their individual checking accounts.

Progress continues with paying back some of the backlog of the monthly Diocesan Assessment contributions by our Parish to the Diocese. However, with the monthly loan payment increasing in June, our financial wellness continues to demand regular attention. Our parish continues to rise to the occasion when certain needs are made (the playground for the children or the fresco beautification project for example), but general donations are cyclical and are dependent upon attendance. This leaves the summer months (occasionally others, depending on when Easter falls) operating at a loss. While other months with events and holidays are able to make up for it in the short term, it prevents us from building up more reserves for the long term.

The audit team encourages our brothers and sisters in the parish via our prayers reflect and please remember your Church when you go on vacation and set aside donations ahead of time. We also encourage as many parishioners as possible to set up automatic donations from your credit card or bank accounts. This not only helps the parish stabilize income throughout the year, but it also allows for each parishioner to ensure they receive the proper tax-deductibility at the end of the year since cash donations are unable to be tracked. Along the same lines, the audit committee encourages the Trusteeship to be proactive and follow up with parishioners whose recurring charges lapse due to credit cards declining so that replacement donations can be given.

We cannot thank the Trusteeship enough for their dedication to St. Luke and all our parishioners. The events of the upcoming year will only keep St. Luke Serbian Orthodox Church growing. We encourage others in our community to join and pledge their support so that our faith and collective spiritual needs can continue to be met by this parish – both now and into the future.
